The semi-annual trash/recycling bill is increasing

... and will take effect with the April 2019 billing. The new fee is \$122.50 for six months. The 10% senior discount rate (ages 60+) is \$110.25 for six months. Bring ID to the township office to be eligible for the discount rate. Bills are mailed April 1 and due April 30. A 1990 ordinance requires all landowners within the township to have their trash picked up by the township hired contractor. Exceptions are apartment buildings with four or more units, and businesses (does not include in-home occupations). Those that are exempt from being on the township trash service are still required to have a licensed LCSWMA approved hauler to pick up their trash. Recycling is mandatory for all residents, including apartment and businesses within the township. Apartment owners are to provide trash removal/recycling opportunities for their tenants. It is the landlord's responsibility to inform their tenants of any ordinances the township has that may affect them. Trash bills can be paid online using credit card or check. ■

► **Disposing of yard waste**

Yard waste collection is every other week beginning the week of April 8 through the week of October 7. It includes leaves, garden residue, shrubbery trimmings, branches less than 2" in diameter. NO GRASS. Yard waste bags will be available at the yard waste facility during their posted days/hours starting April 2 through October 10, or while supply lasts. There is a maximum of 10 bags per visit/20 per week. Put your bag at the curb when it is full; DO NOT use plastic bags. Branches 3" or more in diameter must be cut into 3-foot lengths, bundled, and placed next to your yard waste bags. DO NOT put branches or sticks in your trash can, or piled up (unbundled/untied) on the curb—it will not be collected. ■

3 REMINDERS ABOUT TRASH AND RECYCLING

1 Trash and recycling MUST BE CURBSIDE BY 5:00 am on your scheduled collection day. Recycling is collected the same day as trash, but not always at the same time. Containers should have pre-molded handles; any can or barrel without handles is unacceptable. Containers should have lids to keep birds and squirrels out. Collection allows for three trash bags/cans each week. Additional bags/cans require a YELLOW extra service tag attached to each. Bags/cans must not exceed 32 gallons or 30 pounds, or a RED extra service tag is required. Oversized items (sofa, mattress, carpet) may be put out with the trash (limit 2 per week), and must have a RED tag attached to each. Items too heavy to be lifted by two people will not be accepted. Purchase tags at the township office. No construction/demolition debris will be collected. It must be disposed of at the Lancaster County Solid Waste Facility.




2 Recycling is mandatory in the township, and is a co-mingled program. The only acceptable materials for recycling are: corrugated cardboard, plastic bottles/jugs with necks, metal food/beverage cans, and glass jars/bottles. All items should be cleaned out. Recycle containers can be purchased at the township office, or elsewhere. Be sure it is clearly marked "RECYCLING." In case of rain, snow, ice, or high winds, keep corrugated cardboard inside until the following week.

3 Never put loose sharps/needles in the trash—ALWAYS USE a Safe Clip™ specifically designed for sharps. Lancaster County Solid Waste Management Authority provides them for free, and they are available for purchase at most pharmacies. Place container in the trash, never in recycling. ■

► **Large appliance/tire collection**

April 15–18 on regular trash day. Includes washers, dryers, dishwashers, refrigerators, stoves, air conditioners, etc. \$12 blue tag must be attached to each appliance. Each tire (no rims) requires a \$2 purple tag. No commercial truck tires accepted. Tags are purchased at the township office. Call (717) 291-1213 x301, or email jjyost@twp.lancaster.pa.us to place your address and item(s) on the collection list if you already have a tag. ■

Planning & Zoning

Soliciting in Lancaster Township

In December 2010, the Lancaster Township Board of Supervisors adopted Ordinance 2010-06, setting policies and procedures for any company or individual who wishes to solicit in the township. It was done for the safety and well-being of residents, while providing for those law-abiding people and businesses who have the right to do so. **ANYONE** who wishes to solicit **MUST** first apply for and receive a permit from the township. Exceptions are officers or employees of the township, county, state, or federal government, and charitable, religious, or nonprofit organizations. Canvassing may only occur during the hours of 5:00 pm to 8:00 pm, Monday through Friday, and Noon to 8:00 pm, Saturday and Sunday. The signed permit must be carried at all times. Photo identification is required. No “hard-sell” tactics will be tolerated. Any infraction can mean immediate revocation of the permit. Failure to secure the required permit could result in a \$500 fine for each violation.

Some **VERY IMPORTANT** things to remember when someone approaches your home:

1. Never open your door to a stranger.
2. Do not allow yourself to be “bullied” by anyone who wants access to your home. Ask for ID from anyone who

wishes to discuss anything with you.

3. If you feel threatened in any way, call 911. Call the non-emergency number (717) 664-1180 to report unusual behavior or someone soliciting without a permit. We want to know who these people are.

The majority of people operating in the township do so legally and respectfully, and the people and companies doing so actually welcome questions and are happy to provide documentation. However, there are people whose only concern is for themselves, so we must remain wary of the tactics employed by anyone approaching our homes.

MS4: Stormwater Management

So, you have a drainage swale in your yard or maybe part of a stormwater basin, and it’s not looking all that good. How do you get it fixed? While some might choose to let nature takes its course that is not the best course of action. You may be surprised to learn that you have some responsibility to maintain that swale or basin.

Mostly, the inlets and pipes that are under the township roads belong to the township and are the responsibility of the Public Works Department to maintain. However, those pipes typically have to drain onto privately owned land before the runoff reaches a stream or river. When these pipe discharge points were installed, an easement might

have been established. That easement also might have assigned maintenance responsibility to the property owner or to a Homeowners’ Association (HOA).

The Storm Water Management Ordinance is a good place to start if you’re looking for the legal position of the township. Other things you can do to figure out what should be done:

Assess for yourself how runoff enters and/or leaves your property. Look for any questionable conditions, look at your deed and the subdivision plan that created your lot to see if there’s an easement, and check with the township for any records we might have for your address. Sometimes the responsibility is clearly that of the property owner, and sometimes (like several alleys) it’s a common responsibility. You should also learn what that swale or basin is supposed to look like. Notify the township if you think there’s a problem that you can’t take care of on your own.

The township has worked with many private, commercial, and institutional property owners to assess, plan, guide, repair, clean, and even rehabilitate stormwater management facilities. This collaborative approach helps everyone to avoid the ordinance violation process. It doesn’t always turn out to be a windfall for the property owner, but the township can be in a better position to help if we know that you are aware of your responsibilities. When you see a problem in a township road or park, please contact the office. ■

Public Works - 2019 Road

Maintenance: Lancaster Township makes every effort to keep its roads and streets in good repair by inspecting them frequently. The roads that are repaved are chosen based on inspections and average traffic flow. The summer 2019 preliminary paving list of roads and alleys will be available on the township website sometime in April.

Street Sweeping/Leaf Collection

The following streets have been added to the signed sweeping/collection schedule:

1. Chadwick Circle - West: 1st & 3rd Thurs
8am-11:45am/East: 1st & 3rd Mon 8am-11:45am
2. Colchester Drive - West: 1st & 3rd Thurs
3. 8am -11:45am/East: 1st & 3rd Mon 8am-11:45am
4. Sterling Place, Kentshire, Elmshire, Pennshire, Perthshire, Yorkshire: Tentative Mon/Thurs
8am-11:45am (residents to be notified prior)

The “No Parking” enforcement is now extended through January 16, 2020. The reason for this extension is that street sweeping in the entire township takes place after leaf collection ends. If we need to extend leaf collection, we are unable to do so because of parking, and then we are unable to sweep.

On signed streets, street sweeping resumes on April 2 and leaf collection begins October 15. Both take place the first and third Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday of each month, ending January 16, 2020.

Abide by the schedule as it appears on the street sign. **NO WARNING NOTICES WILL BE ISSUED!** Police will enforce street signs that prohibit parking. Illegally parked vehicles prevent the cleaning of the streets. Parking restrictions will remain in force until the end of the sweeping/collection season, which is January 16, 2020. The 2019 sweeping/collection calendar for signed streets can be found on the township website. Reminder—weather can affect the sweeping/collection schedule.

Street/Alley Tree Policy

Property owners are responsible for the care and pruning of all trees and shrubs along any street or township-maintained alley, whether in or out of the right-of-way. Overgrown trees, bushes, and hedges can cause plows/trucks to damage right-of-way plantings, can cause equipment breakage, and is dangerous for the crew. Most alleys have a 14-ft. right-of-way width that must be clear of any fences, vegetation, or objects within this 14-ft. distance. If you have right-of-way encroachment, please remove it. Right-of-way encroachment is the cause of damage to passing vehicles and contributes as a cause of accidents when drivers cross the centerline to avoid contact with overhanging branches etc. A minimum distance of 14 ft. must be maintained between the

road surface and the lowest overhanging branch above our streets through the entire Right of Way.

Smaller trees and shrubs should be pruned to allow signs to be clearly seen. We will be inspecting intersections for traffic visibility. If a visibility problem is noticed, the township reserves the right to do any necessary pruning.

If a tree or limb blocks a township roadway/alley, we will attempt to open it for the safe passage of vehicles. If a fallen tree or branch is too large for us to handle, the roadway/alley will be closed and the property owner will have 24 hours to have it removed. The

responsibility of the property owner is to secure a private contractor to clear and remove any debris in order to reopen the roadway/alley. If a property owner does not arrange for timely removal or cannot be reached to do so, the township will contact a contractor and the property owner will be billed for those services.

Yard Waste Dropoff

The yard waste facility opens on Tuesday, April 2. Days and hours of operation are Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday 3:00 pm to 7:00 pm until October 10, then 2:00 pm to 5:00 pm Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday until November 27. The facility will be closed on May 25, July 4, and August 31. The facility will now be open **EVERY SATURDAY 8:00 am to 1:00 pm, APRIL 6 THROUGH NOVEMBER 23**. Excluded Saturdays are May 25 and August 31. The facility is closed all Mondays, Fridays, Sundays, and holidays. The facility closing date is Wednesday, November 27. No contractors—service is for township residents only. Have ID ready for the gate attendant who will inspect yard waste for contaminants and direct you to the proper place to unload. Users of the facility must enter via the Elm Avenue driveway behind the Giant Store, and exit only via Maple Grove driveway onto Columbia Avenue eastbound. **THERE WILL BE NO EXIT VIA MEADOWCREEK OR ELM AVENUE. ALL TRAFFIC MUST EXIT USING EASTBOUND COLUMBIA AVENUE.**

Mulch and Compost

Mulch/compost will be available for **hand-loading** inside the Woody Waste facility after April 2, whenever the facility is open and on a first-come, first-served basis depending on availability. Mulch/compost will be loaded Tuesday–Thursday, 3:30 pm to 4:15 pm until May 30 and the first Saturday of each month (until June 1) from 8 am to Noon. ■


