A FEW THINGS HAVE CHANGED AROUND THE OFFICE....

FIRST, there is a **NEW ENTRANCE** to the township building. Residents and visitors now enter from the Maple Avenue side of the building, across the street from the larger parking lot. TRASH, RECYCLING & ENVIRONMENT

Semi-annual trash/recycling bills will be mailed October 1 and are due October 30. To protect staff and visitors, and assist with social distancing guidelines, **residents are encouraged to pay their bill through one of the three preferred methods:**

1. **ONLINE PAYMENT** (by credit card or check)
2. **DROP-BOX** at the Maple Avenue door. *Place check or money order and the payment stub in a sealed envelope. (No cash, please, when using the drop-box.)*
3. **MAIL** check or money order and the payment stub to the township office. **(No cash, please, when mailing payment.)**

If you want to pay at the reception window--**a mask is required to enter the building and you must adhere to the six foot social distancing. If the reception area is full when you arrive, you will need to wait outside until someone exits the building.**

The semi-annual fee is \$122.50. There is a 10% senior discount rate (\$110.25) available to residents ages 60+. *Proof of age is required for the discount.* Just include a copy of your ID with your payment if you use the drop-box or mail it in. Trash & recycling MUST BE CURBSIDE BY 5:00am on your scheduled collection day. Trash & recycling should not be placed on the curb earlier than the evening before collection day, and containers should be promptly removed after collection. Trash bags, containers, recycling bin must be within five (5) feet of the curb

and clearly visible to the collector. Recycling is collected the same day as trash, but not always at the same time. [Link to collection information.](#)

Trash is limited to three 32-gallon trash cans or bags per week, no more than 30 pounds each.

- Additional cans or bags must have a **YELLOW** extra service tag (\$1.25) attached to each.
- Cans and/or bags weighing more than 30 pounds, or [over-sized items](#) (e.g. sofa, mattress, or carpet) must have a **RED** extra service tag (\$4.00) attached to each.

If your trash and/or recycling is missed, you must report it the same day or next day by 10:00am in order for it to be collected the day after your scheduled day; otherwise, it will have to wait until your next scheduled collection day.

All residents should use approved trash containers—meaning trash containers should have pre-molded handles. **Fifty-five (55) gallon barrels or any barrel without handles are unacceptable.** Containers should have lids to help keep birds, squirrels, & other animals from spreading trash around your neighborhood.

All landowners within the township must have their refuse picked up by the township hired contractor—Waste Management. Exceptions are apartment buildings with four or more units, and businesses (not including in-home occupations). Those that are exempt from being on the township trash service are still required to have a licensed LCSWMA approved hauler to pick up their trash. Apartment owners are to provide trash/recycling opportunities for their tenants. **It is the landlord's responsibility to inform tenants of any ordinances the township has that may affect them.**

***Illegal dumping of any regulated material is a punishable offense.
Lancaster Township will enforce all regulations and impose penalties on violators.***

RECYCLING is mandatory in Lancaster Township for all residents, apartment dwellers, and businesses within the township. This is a co-mingled program. **ONLY the "BIG 4"** are accepted for recycling:

1. Corrugated cardboard
2. Plastic bottles/jugs with necks (does not include lids)
3. Metal food/beverage cans
4. Glass jars/bottles (does not include lids)

- All items should be cleaned out before placing in the recycle bin.
- **DO NOT** put recycling in a plastic bag or paper bag before placing in the bin. **It will not be collected.**
- In case of rain, snow, ice, or high winds, keep corrugated cardboard inside until the following week.

Recycle containers may be purchased at the township office at a cost of \$10.00 each, or you may purchase one at Lowes, Home Depot, etc. *It is recommended that residents write their name and address on both their trash and recycle receptacles.*



BATTERIES & CELL PHONES are **NO LONGER ACCEPTED** at the township office FOR DISPOSAL.

However, the battery/cell phone collection bags are still available to pick up during regular office hours.

DO NOT bring or leave filled battery bags at the township office. When the bag is full, place the collection bag on the ground next to your trash container, **NOT IN IT**. The trash hauler will collect the bag(s) during regular trash pick-up.

NOTE on 9-volt batteries: Before placing 9-volt batteries in the collection bag, be sure to cover the positive and negative posts with masking, duct, or electrical tape first.

Automotive batteries may not be put out for trash collection. Residents can take them to the [Lancaster County Household Hazardous Waste Facility](#) at 1299 Harrisburg Pike.

ELECTRONIC WASTE is **PROHIBITED** from being disposed of with your trash or recycling by the PA Covered Devices Recycling Act 108 of 2010. Residents **MUST take these items** to the county [Household](#)

[Hazardous Waste Facility](#) at 1299 Harrisburg Pike. (717) 397-9968; email: info@lcswma.org.

Residents and businesses may drop electronic waste for FREE at the HHW Facility, with a limit of 10 items per customer, per day. All electronics must be intact and will not be accepted by the HHW Facility otherwise.

Items include:

- Desktop computers & Laptops
- Monitors & Computer peripherals, including keyboard, mouse, printer and speakers
- Televisions & e-Readers
- Cameras: photo and video
- Cell phones, smart phones and peripherals: chargers, batteries, Bluetooth earpieces, air cards, clips, cases
- DVD and VCR players
- MP3 players and iPods
- All electronic game players, video game consoles, and controllers
- Stereos and peripherals: CD players, turntables, amplifiers, speakers (no wooden materials)

DISPOSE OF USED SHARPS, NEEDLES AND MEDICAL WASTE SAFELY!

NEVER put loose sharps/needles in the trash—**ALWAYS USE a Safe Clip™**. [Lancaster County Solid Waste Management Authority](#) provides them for free, and they are available for purchase at most pharmacies. Once full, place container in the trash, never in recycling. SPECIAL COLLECTION DATES

Curbside Collection of Yard Waste

ENDS the week of October 12, 2020.

Yard waste is collected every other week on your regular collection day. Information, including a [Special Collection Calendar](#), is available on the township website.

Collection includes leaves, garden residue, shrubbery trimmings, branches less than 2" in diameter. Larger branches, 3" or more in diameter, must be cut into 4-foot lengths, bundled/tied, and placed next to your yard waste bags.

Collection **DOES NOT include**: grass clippings, fruit & vegetable waste, tree stumps, dirt, rocks, or stones. *Bags containing these items will not be collected, and will be left at the curb.*

Yard waste bags are no longer available at the woody waste facility until spring 2021. You may purchase yard waste bags at Lowes, Home Depot, or another store of your choice. **REMINDER -- Yard Waste in plastic bags will not be collected.**

Large Appliance & Tire Collection:

November 16-19, 2020,
on your regular collection day.



\$12 Blue tag must be attached to EACH appliance.
Includes washers, dryers, dishwashers, refrigerators, stoves, air conditioners, dehumidifiers, etc.

\$2.00 Purple tag must be attached to EACH tire.
Standard car, truck, or motorcycle tires only.
NO RIMS. NO COMMERCIAL OR OVER-SIZED TIRES.

Tags can be purchased at the township office during regular business hours. If you already have a tag, email jyost@twp.lancaster.pa.us or call (717) 291-1213 to place your address and item(s) on the collection list.

This special collection is twice a year--spring & fall.

- Service is for Lancaster Township **residents ONLY**--*have ID ready for the gate attendant.*
- **All traffic must enter via the Elm Avenue service road** (behind Giant at Stone Mill Plaza). The service road is ONE WAY INTO

MAPLE GROVE.

- All traffic will exit via Columbia Avenue Eastbound only.
- Access to the facility will be controlled, and there may be delays. We appreciate your patience.
- Please abide by CDC guidelines and maintain social distancing to protect our employees and township residents.

LEAF COLLECTION on *signed streets* begins October 15, 2020. Takes place the *first & third Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, & Thursday of each month*, ending January 15, 2021. [Click here](#) for the 2020 sweeping/collection calendar for signed streets.

Police will enforce street signs that prohibit parking.
NO WARNING NOTICES WILL BE ISSUED!
Abide by the schedule as it appears on the street sign.

The “No Parking” enforcement is extended through **January 15, 2021** in order to make a final sweeping of the streets after leaf collection ends. **ALL weather and equipment issues can affect the sweeping/collection schedule.** [READ MORE...](#)

Street/Alley Tree Policy...Property owners are responsible for the care and pruning of all trees and shrubs along any street or township-maintained alley, whether in or out of the right-of way. Overgrown trees, bushes, and hedges can cause plows/trucks to damage right-of-way plantings, can cause equipment breakage, and is dangerous for the crew. Most alleys have a 14 ft. right-of-way width that must be clear of any fences, vegetation, or objects within this 14 ft. distance. If you have right-of-way encroachment, please remove it. CLEAN UP AFTER YOUR DOG!

Pet waste poses a significant impact on your health and the health of the watershed if not disposed of properly. Pet waste is toxic to your lawn and contains harmful bacteria such as Giardia, Salmonella and E. coli. Anyone who comes into contact with that soil through gardening, playing, or walking barefoot runs the risk of infection. Children are most susceptible since they play in the dirt and put things in their mouths or eyes.

By [Ordinance No. 1992-2, Section 96-4](#): “No owner shall permit any dog or other animal to defecate upon any public property or the property of another person unless the owner immediately cleans up and removes the defecation and disposes of it in a sanitary manner. The provisions of this section shall not apply to a guide dog accompanying a blind person or otherwise assisting a person with a disability.”



The township ordinance clearly states that not cleaning up after your pet is a violation. More than that, it is disrespectful and unsanitary. Cleaning up after your pet is the right thing to do. Be considerate, carry plastic bags and paper towels in your pocket. Dispose of pet waste properly in the trash. Your family, your neighbors, and the environment will appreciate your good manners.

The Little Conestoga isn't Really all that Little

Anything that drains 65.5 square miles doesn't deserve to be called "Little." Granted, it is smaller and flows into the larger waterway with the same name—perhaps it's just a case of lazy name-giving. The Little Conestoga starts in Penn Township and flows through 13 municipalities, with flows from six other tributaries before joining itself with the Conestoga River, where Lock No. 6 of the Conestoga Navigation system was built in the 1820s.


Depending on how you differentiate between the terms, the Little Conestoga is more of a river than a creek. Although it hasn't seen the same recreational uses as its larger counterpart, it has suffered many of the same pollutant loading from the upstream land uses as the larger river. Our agrarian predecessors found it necessary to build many mills and dams along and across the Little Conestoga. Now, as most of those mills have disappeared and dams were destroyed or deteriorated, the legacy sediment behind those dams is quickly being eroded by the increase in uncontrolled runoff.

Along with other public agencies, we are working to reduce the resultant pollutants from our water and from that which reaches the Chesapeake Bay. The Little Conestoga is so vital to our community that it has its own Watershed Alliance, dedicated to "creating a comprehensive approach to continual enhancement of water quality, stream restoration and preservation of natural resources within the Little Conestoga Creek Watershed." Many volunteer and project opportunities actively make a difference in achieving the Alliance's goals.

The Little Conestoga serves the Township in many ways. Legally, it's our boundary with East Hempfield and with Manor (south of Columbia Avenue). Many property lines were established based on the Little

Conestoga. All of School Lane Hills drains into the Little Conestoga, but most of us rarely take notice of it, unless driving over a bridge.

Our County's land uses over the last three centuries have impacted the Little Conestoga, laying up sediment, pollutants, and debris, then scouring all that away with greater flows. Much of the natural aquatic life has been obliterated. The Little Conestoga is one of our neighborhood streams, and stewardship of its environment helps not just us, but those future generations in whose care we will place our community.

The Manheim Township Police Department has developed a **Special Needs Registry** (SNR) to better serve members of our community. The SNR is a voluntary registration where persons with special needs submit information that will be helpful to emergency service workers during an emergency. The special needs classifications include, but are not limited to: autism, dementia, and any other physical or mental disabilities.

The SNR will compile data that may help locate loved ones of someone who may be lost or locate someone that will need assistance in evacuating from their residence in an emergency. The data will be managed by the police department and will only be shared as needed with emergency workers assisting the police. Participants will be issued decals to clue emergency workers that the police have data on the individual.

LOCK YOUR DOORS every time you leave your vehicle. A vast majority of vehicles that are stolen or burglarized have been because the vehicles were unlocked.

Do not leave any type of weapons or spare keys in your car. Do not leave valuables or even cheap items in plain sight. Thieves often look into vehicles to see if it is worth breaking into, and although you think something may be worthless, they may see value in it to them.

If you park in your garage, make sure you lock your garage door. And don't leave your garage door opener inside your vehicle if it is parked on the street. If your vehicle gets broken into, then your garage door opener now gives them access to your house.

Call the police whenever you see anyone suspicious in the area. It is always better to be safe rather than sorry.

HALLOWEEN SAFETY TIPS!



- ✦ Make sure costumes are sized correctly to avoid tripping or falling.
- ✦ Use non-toxic makeup instead of a mask so vision is not limited.
- ✦ Always accompany your young child when they are trick or treating.

- ✦ Walk on the sidewalk and don't let children run across the street to get to the next house.

BICYCLE SAFETY is a shared responsibility among everyone on the road. When driving and approaching a bicyclist, only pass if and when it is safe and legal to do so.

If you are riding your bicycle, *it is a vehicle.*

- Bicyclists must stop and yield to traffic before riding across a road.
- Bicyclists will have the right of way **ONLY** if they dismount and cross as a pedestrian.
- Bicyclists should always ride with the direction of traffic.
- Just as vehicles use turn signals, bicyclists should use the correct hand and arm signals.

EVERYONE IS A PEDESTRIAN. Think about it--at some point every day, everyone is a pedestrian. Whether you are out just taking a walk, crossing the street to get to work or to another destination, or traveling through a parking lot on your way into the store, **YOU ARE A PEDESTRIAN.** The rights and duties of pedestrians vary greatly depending on the situation. It's important to familiarize yourself with [Pennsylvania laws](#), as well as [common-sense safety tips](#). Click on [THIS LINK](#) to read more....

When running or walking on the road, follow these safety tips:

- Use sidewalks whenever they are available. If no sidewalk is available, you must walk on the left side of the road **FACING traffic.**
- **BE VISIBLE AT ALL TIMES!** Wear reflective materials and/or bright clothing. Use a flashlight at night.
- NEVER assume a driver sees you. Make eye contact with drivers as they approach you to make sure you are seen.
- Cross streets at the crosswalk or intersections whenever possible. **DO NOT** cross the street between parked vehicles. **AND always LOOK before crossing the road!**
- **DO NOT** walk from the sidewalk or shoulder into the path of a vehicle.
- Keep alert at all times. That means putting away your electronic devices so you can stay focused on the road. **LOOK AHEAD; NOT DOWN AT YOUR PHONE!**
- Wear ID and carry your cell phone *in your pocket.*



DEER ON THE MOVE, MOTORISTS USE CAUTION

With fall ushering in, deer become more active with the lead-up to their fall breeding season. Motorists are advised to slow down and stay alert. Dusk and dawn are the peak hours for deer activity.

Deer will often travel in groups, walking single file, so, even if one deer successfully crosses the road in front of you, it doesn't mean the threat is over--another could be right behind it.

Reduce your chances of a collision with a deer by just **paying attention while you are driving.**
